

Signal / Reporting Verbs

Signal / reporting verbs help to create a distinction between your voice and the ideas of the sources you referred to as support.

Writers should try to vary the choice of signal / reporting verbs to maintain variety and reader interest, **but writers should also choose the verb that appropriately characterizes the context of the idea being borrowed**. Signal / reporting verbs also help to synthesize and integrate your sources smoothly into your own writing.
